Catherine McAuley Feast Day

Our day commenced with a sacred Liturgy celebrating our Catherine McAuley, a woman who dedicated her life to helping others, especially training poor girls and women to give them a future. Catherine also distributed food and clothing to the needy and performing other works of Mercy. She is the founder of the Sisters of Mercy and in 1990 she was declared "Venerable," which is the first stage in being made a Saint.

Our children learnt a bit more about who Catherine McAuley was through lessons and activities planned to strengthen their knowledge on who this wonderful person was. Catherine McAuley died on the 11th of November and ironically her Feast Day is shared with Remembrance Day.

Catherine McAuley School Year 6 Mercy Awards

From the Year 2 Unit

In Week 3, our Year 2 students had an exciting and educational excursion to IWS. They enjoyed a fascinating bus tour of the Jeffries green waste and composting site, where they got a close-up view of the process that turns organic waste into compost. The abundance

of birds at the site caught the students' attention, drawn by the food scraps in the waste.

The tour also included the area where red or blue-lidded rubbish bins are emptied and sorted before the waste heads to a landfill in Dublin. Here, too, students noticed many birds—reminding them of the impact food waste has when it ends up in landfills. They learned a memorable rule to help reduce waste: "If it grows, in the green bin it goes!"

While at the KESAB Education Centre, students engaged in hands-on activities to deepen their understanding of waste management and sustainability. They sorted household rubbish, practiced recycling, explored the composting cycle, and even calculated emissions from garbage truck collections in a digital activity. A highlight was the "nude food" lunch box activity, where students sorted items into two lunchboxes—one filled with wasteful packaging destined for the landfill, and another with reusable containers that help minimise waste.

The excursion was a fantastic opportunity for students to learn about the importance of proper waste sorting and sustainability practices in a fun, interactive way!
