The 2024 School Year is quickly coming to an end. So much has happened with the children, they have learnt new skills and information in the different learning areas, made new friends, grown that little bit taller and wiser as they soaked in all the skills, content and experiences of 2024.

Advent

As we entered the Christmas Season last week with the beginning of Advent, this is a time of preparation for the coming of our Saviour. Advent is derived from the Latin word *adventus*, which means "coming" or "arrival." Advent is a four-week season dedicated to reflective preparation for the arrival, "advent", of the baby Jesus. Each week of Advent, a new candle is lit, and each candle has its own meaning and symbolism bringing us closer to the birth of Jesus.

The Advent wreath symbolizes everlasting life and unending love and each candle has a different focus, and a new candle is lit every Sunday before Christmas.

The first purple candle is the Candle of Hope, also known as the Prophet's Candle. This candle marks the beginning of the Advent season and sets the tone for the spiritual journey towards Christmas. As the flickering flame illuminates the darkness, it symbolizes the hope that permeates the hearts of believers, reminding them of the promise of salvation and the anticipation of the birth of Jesus Christ. It is also known as the Prophet's Candle because, we wait in hope for the arrival of the Prophet, Jesus our saviour.

The second purple candle is the Candle of Peace, also known as the Bethlehem Candle. The candle of Peace extends beyond the absence of conflict and turmoil. It encompasses a profound state of spiritual well-being, fostering a sense of harmony and unity within oneself and with the world at large. The flickering flame serves as a beacon of hope, illuminating the path towards reconciliation and forgiveness. Also known as the Bethlehem Candle," signifies Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.

The third candle is the Candle of Joy, and it is represented by the colour pink. It marks a pivotal moment in the spiritual journey towards Christmas. As the radiant flame of the third candle is kindled, it ignites a profound sense of jubilation and Joy in the anticipation of the arrival of the baby Jesus. It is also known as the Shepherd's Candle, as it represents the joy that filled the hearts of the shepherds who received the news of Jesus' birth from the angels.

The fourth purple candle is the Candle of Love, also known as the Angels candle. The lighting of this candle represents the Love received in the world with the coming of the baby Jesus. It is also known as the Angels Candle as it reminds us of the angels' message: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men and Women"

The final candle is a white candle and is lit on Christmas day representing the arrival of Jesus our saviour.

Each week, from the first of December, during our Morning Prayer we lit a candle from the Advent Wreath, explaining the meaning behind the candles, strengthening the children's relationship with Jesus and the Catholic faith.

Nativity

This year, our Reception Children were involved in a beautiful performance of the Nativity Story, the story of the birth of Jesus. They were so wonderful in depicting the Nativity story, we had several performances, two at school and one at the Parish at St Ann's Church. Captivating the Parishioners and Fr Santosh. I am forever grateful to Mrs Pollard, Mrs King, Mrs Brodley and Mrs Mynhardt, the parents who volunteered to assist, and of course to the children, the stars of the performances.


Charity Stalls


McAuley Community. As all the Year 6 Students were presented their aspirations and most memorable moments were told and they ended the night with a fun Disco.
















Social Media Legislation

PREMIER OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA

Dear parent/caregiver

Today, the Federal Parliament passed laws to implement 16 years as the minimum age for access to social media.

This globally-leading reform was initiated here in South Australia.

The State Government was determined to see reform in this area amid mounting concern and recognition from experts, clinicians, educators, parents and caregivers of the negative impacts of social media use on children's mental health, wellbeing and development.

Following substantial engagement with these stakeholders, it became clear to us that, on balance, a national minimum age for access to social media, is the right thing to do.

That's why here in South Australia, we commissioned former Chief Justice of the High Court, the Hon. Robert French AC, to conduct an independent legal examination into enforcing a minimum age limit for social media access.

His report outlined a path forward to legislate; however, our preference was always for a nationally consistent law, which is why I raised the matter at National Cabinet.

Now, through the work we started here in South Australia, our nation will be a global leader in keeping our next generation safe from the harms of social media.

When we see products doing children harm, whether it be drugs, cigarettes or alcohol, governments have a role to play. The addictive nature of social media is no different.

The national laws will commence following a 12-month implementation period and will establish a minimum age for platforms like Facebook, Snapchat, TikTok and Instagram. They will place the onus on social media platforms – not parents or young people – to take reasonable steps to keep kids under 16 years of age off their platforms.

In 2019, we announced that in Government, we would pursue a full mobile phone ban for students in South Australian Government schools. We've seen strong and positive outcomes from this pursuit and now every other state has implemented a similar ban.

From next year, all students in state government and Catholic schools will be taught about online safety and the dangers of social media through a strengthened curriculum, providing the tools to navigate the online world confidently and safely.

The new social media laws are another step in ensuring our kids live healthy, active lives – and that smartphones and social media are not the defining feature of their childhood.

We are proud that South Australia has led the way on this important reform that will ensure our children and young people are protected and well-equipped for the world they are growing up in.
